SPEAKING OF SPEAKERS

Boat Club membership meetings have four popular features:

- 1. A chance to hang out with the friendliest group of folks in town.
- 2. An outstanding potluck dinner.
- 3. Latest news about Boat Club cruises and activities.
- 4. An interesting speaker.



Our Speaker Program was developed to bring variety and interest to our meetings. Over the years we have had presentations on a wide variety of topics, some related to our boating interests and some addressing other issues that are relevant to our members.

We have had presentations about local historical topics, such as the Fort King National Historical Landmark and the surprisingly rich archaeological heritage of Marion County. Water issues always have interest for boaters, so speakers have addressed topics such as the water flows in the Silver River and the quality of drinking water that comes from our Floridan Aquifer. From time to time we've had speakers on health topics like autism and stroke prevention. Regardless of the specific topic, Boat Club speakers always get a positive response from members.

We normally stay away from partisan political fights, but we do not hesitate to address current or controversial issues that are important for our community and interesting to our members. Examples include the Adena Springs Ranch (now Sleepy Creek), Rodman Reservoir, and last year's medical marijuana ballot issue.

Andrea Rossiter manages the Speaker Program. She and I did the job together for the first two years, and Andrea has run the program since then. She generates ideas for speaker presentations from newspaper articles and TV reports, from her own personal interests, and often from suggestions by Boat Club members. Once a speaker is booked, Andrea develops an announcement for publication in the Helmsman. She also helps arrange audio-visual support and introduces the speaker to members at the meeting.

Andrea reports that she has met lots of interesting people by inviting them to visit the Boat Club. "Speakers are easy to recruit in Ocala and Marion," she says, "Everyone knows about the Boat Club and is happy to come visit. And the lure of the Potluck Dinner doesn't hurt, either!"

Andrea will retire as speaker coordinator at the end of 2015, opening up an opportunity for another Boat Club member to manage the Speaker Program. The job usually requires 1-2 hours per month. If you're interested, contact Andrea at (303) 929-2983 or 352-369-9639.




Captain Jon Semmes to Talk About Water Issues

Captain Jon Semmes of Singing River Tours in Dunnellon will be our speaker this month and he will be talking about waterways, specifically the Rainbow and Withlacoochee Rivers, and the problems facing our area's water supply. Jon has extensive experience in boating, and a deep love and respect for the ecology of our state. Through the course of his life Jon has spent many enjoyable hours on the Rainbow and Withlacoochee Rivers, and knows the rivers intimately. He has studied the history of Dunnellon and he shares stories of Dunnellon's Boomtown history along with his knowledge of native wildlife on the singing river tours he gives. Spending so much time on these waterways gives Jon a unique perspective on the pressures faced by the rivers.
