Volunteers are GREAT!

The Ocala Boat Club depends on its members to volunteer to do work around the building, during meetings, and for special events. Volunteering lets you spend time to get to know other members and gives you the satisfaction of knowing that you have helped make the Club better for everyone.

Volunteering is easy! All you have to do is ask Commodore David Rossiter or Vice Commodore Chuck Lemon and they will help find you a job to do that fit your schedule and your interests. The Board of Directors over sees several committees that all need volunteers. The Membership committee needs people to help recruit new members and retain present members. The Historian maintains records of Club activities and could use help. The Building, Grounds and Rental committee can always use someone who is willing to come mow the grass. During the growing season the grass is mowed weekly and the weed eater is used every few weeks to neaten up around trees and posts on the property. Maintaining the building is an ongoing job with touching up the walls with paint, burnishing the floors, and other projects that come up periodically. The Club rental business could use more members willing to be on call on weekends when we have an event in the building. The Newsletter and Website committee would like to have members willing to write articles about Club activities that they participate in to be included in the monthly Helmsman newsletter. Anyone taking pictures at an activity is also welcome to share those in the newsletter. Programs and Entertainment is the committee that plans special events for the Club. This includes our Christmas Party each year along with developing ideas for other parties that the members would like to participate in. In the past these have included an Oktoberfest Celebration, a Cabaret, and a 50s Night. These events featured live music and food, raising money for the Club. The Kitchen and Supplies committee is responsible for getting volunteers to work in the kitchen for our potluck each month as well as requesting needed supplies be bought by the Vice Commodore. Jan is looking for someone willing to take over as Chairman of this committee and will be happy to train her replacement. The final committee is the Safety committee. Although the Safety committee is new it is especially important as the group will devise activities to promote safe boating practices among our members and their guests. It is hoped that the committee will be able to present a short safety lesson each month at the meetings. Although the Speaker Program doesn't have its own committee, as David Rossiter wrote last month, Andrea is looking for a volunteer to take over her position in January.

Some members that have already found a place to volunteer include those people that came out last Wednesday for a Club Cleanup Day. Joann Beach, Judy Charron, Flo Hoffman and Rita Trombley spent their day giving the Club's kitchen a good cleaning including the stoves and all the cabinets. New member Mike Groves and Chuck Lemon burnished all the floors. John Beach, Chuck Boyett and Dick Charron trimmed the shrubs all around the building and along the woods in front of the building, filling up a truck and trailer full of brush they cut. These members deserve a great big **THANK YOU** from all of us for spending their entire day at the Club House working. The building is now ready for our Open House on Saturday, October 17th.
